New Brunswick, New Jersey was the site of the 42ndAnnual Meeting of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest. The meeting was hosted by The College of New Jersey (TCNJ) and West Chester University of Pennsylvania and held from September 26-28, 2013. Special thanks go out to Regina Morin and Israel Sanz-Sánchez, the Local Arrangements and Program Chairs respectively, who did a superb job of making sure we were all comfortable and well fed! We would also like to thank all the faculty and student volunteers who contributed to the success of the conference, and host institutions for their generous logistical and financial support.

The LASSO Executive Committee Meeting was held Thursday evening. The morning of Friday, September 27, featured parallel sessions on Politeness and second person forms of address, Historical syntax and morphology, Sociolinguistics, and English linguistics and ESL pedagogy. There was a Special Session offered by Pamela Anderson-Mejías and Hugo A. Mejías, the joint editors of *The Southwest Journal of Linguistics*. There was a special panel on Teaching Spanish for Special Purposes in the 21st Century, Part I and Part II. The Plenary Address, "CALL Research and Practice: Quo vadis?", delivered by Robert Blake of the University of California, Davis, brought the day to a close.

Saturday, September 28, saw a full day of presentations including such diverse topics as Prosody,

Computer-based approaches to language research, Online language teaching, Phonological processes, Language acquisition, Language pedagogy for heritage speakers, and Historical approaches to the sociology of language, among others. Jens Clegg (Indiana U-Purdue U Fort Wayne) closed the conference with his Presidential Address, "LASSO and the Spanish of the Southwest: A 40-Year Odyssey".

Carmen Silva-Corvalán's book, "Bilingual Language Acquisition: Spanish and English in the First Six Years", appeared in 2014 (Cambridge University Press). In it she considers: How do children develop bilingual competence? Do bilingual children develop language in the same way as monolinguals? Set in the context of findings on language development, this book examines the acquisition of English and Spanish by two brothers in the first six years of their lives. Based on in-depth and meticulous analyses of naturalistic data, it explores how the systems of both languages affect each other as the children develop, and how different levels of exposure to each language influence the nature of acquisition. The author demonstrates that the children's grammars and lexicons follow a developmental path similar to that of monolinguals, but that cross-linguistic interactions affecting lexical, semantic and discourse-pragmatic aspects arise in Spanish when exposure to it diminishes around the age of four. The first of its kind, this original study is a must-read for students and researchers in bilingualism, child development, language acquisition and language contact.

Reymundo Romero's article "Palatal east meets velar west: Dialect contact and phonological accommodation in Judeo-Spanish" was published in the Fall 2013 (6:2) issue of *Studies in Hispanic and Lusophone Linguistics*. His chapter "Compensating for the loss of linguistic domains: Glosses in Judeo-Spanish texts" was published in Rafael Orozco's *New Directions in Hispanic Linguistics* in February 2014.

Daniel Villa, Naomi Lapidus Shin, and Eva Robles Nagata have an article, "*La nueva frontera*: Spanish-Speaking Populations in Central Washington" to appear in *Studies in Hispanic and Lusophone Linguistics*.

Holly Cashman and Chase Raymond have an article, "Doing Gender in Soccer (Football) and Beyond: Making Gender Relevant in Spanish-language Broadcast Discourse", accepted for publication in *Gender and Language*.

This award is named in honor of Helmut Esau, who was active in the early days of LASSO. Professor Esau died in an automobile accident shortly after he was elected to the LASSO presidency, and his colleagues at the time established the Esau Award to commemorate his contributions to the Linguistic Association of the Southwest and to the profession at large.

Submission of Abstracts and Proposals

We welcome abstracts for papers in all areas of linguistics. Abstracts for papers or panels on Heritage Languages in the era of e-learning, and particularly those Heritage languages found in the Southwest U.S., are especially welcome. Proposals for complete panels with multiple speakers are also welcome but must fit within the 90 minute time frame of the conference presentations.

Submissions by graduate students are welcome, and students are eligible for the Helmut Esau Prize, which includes a \$400 cash award.

Presentation format:

Presentation time for papers will be 20 minutes plus 10 minutes for discussion. Abstracts may be in English or Spanish. Presentations should be given in the same language as the abstract. Only one abstract as single author and a second as co-author will be accepted from any one individual.

Abstract format:

Abstracts should be 250-500 words, single-spaced in 12 point Times New Roman font. Abstracts should summarize the main points and indicate key aspects of the data and methodology. Use of special font items should be kept to a minimum. In general, omit the bibliography. Abstracts will be distributed via the Internet as received. At the beginning of the abstract, write the title of the paper. At the end of the abstract, repeat the title and also list the author's name (if more than one author, list names in the order they should appear in the program), academic affiliation, mailing address, telephone number, cellular phone number, and email. If the first author, who will be point of contact for the submission, will not be available at his/her usual address or e-mail during the summer, provide summer contact information in the cover e-mail.

Abstract submission:

Abstracts should be submitted via <u>EasyAbs</u> as a .pdf, .txt, .doc or .odt file. Special font items travel best in a .pdf file. For questions, e-mail

<u>LASSO2014sandiego@gmail.com</u>. Do not submit abstracts to this e-mail address.

Authors will receive a reply notifying them that their abstracts are under consideration. If such notification has not been received within one week, the abstract did not reach its destination and should be resent. Authors will be notified by late July as to whether their papers have been accepted.

- Submit manuscripts in either English or Spanish.
- Include an abstract in English of between 100 and 150 words.
- Submit 1 copy in WORD and one in pdf or hard copy for comparison (especially if symbols are used).

Given the comprehensive goal of the journal, attention is drawn particularly to the *Language* style sheet provision that contributors provide the names and addresses of appropriate referees.

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2013 Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

The LASSO Executive Committee met Thursday night, September 26, 2013 at the Heldrich Hotel in New Brunswick, New Jersey. Members in Attendance: Regina Morin, Executive Director; Jens Clegg, President. Members: Holly Cashman, Joke Mondada, Pamela Anderson Mejías, Michael R. The committee:

1. Approved the minutes of the 2012 Executive Committee Meeting in Fort Wayne, IN.

2. Accepted Morin's financial report for the period of October 2012 through September 2013. The opening balance was \$39,430.85. Income for the year was \$6,224.69, including \$114.67 in dividends, \$485.20 refunded by the Las Cruces conference, and \$5,624.82 from membership fees and the sale of back issues. Total expenses for the year were \$3,383.26, including the 2012 Esau Award (\$400), Postage for SWJL 30(2) (\$249.26) the refund of one institutional subscription through EBSCO (\$75), the transfer of the journals to the new co-editors (\$512), and the 2013 Executive Committee meeting venue and dinner (\$2,147). The resulting bank balance is \$42, 272.28. The total is approximate, since there were membership and royalty payments made right before the conference that were not tabulated, and it was expected that SWJL 30(2) and 31(1) would be invoiced shortly after the conference.

3. Accepted Jens Clegg's report on the Esau Award. The Award went to Vanessa Elias of Indiana University for her paper "*Expresión de sujeto: El caso de Antonito, Colorado*". Jens received four good-quality polished papers. 4. Accepted Morin's and Sanz Sanchez's report on the 2013 conference. In terms of finances it was not expected that the income would cover all the expenses. Daniel Villa suggested that there be a minimum and maximum registration fee to be charged at conferences depending on the economic realities of the different geographical regions where the conferences are held. With regard to the program, approximately 104 abstracts were received. A small number were rejected, mainly due to lack of academic rigor. There were approximately 5 last minute cancellations due to health issues, reduced university funding, or death in the family.

5. Accepted Ramos Pellicia's report on the 2014 conference to be sponsored by Cal State University, San Marcos, from September 18 through 20. Kim Potowski has accepted an invitation to be the plenary speaker. Pamela Anderson Mejías agreed to be nominated for 2014 program chair.

6. Accepted Alfandre's report on the 2015 conference to be hosted by ASU College at Lake Havasu in mid September. Elly Van Gelderen agreed to be nominated for program chair.

7. Accepted the following Committee and other nominations:

- Executive Director: Three candidates to be voted on at the Business Meeting: Holly Cashman, Daniel Villa, and Donna West.
- Executive Committee: Danielle Alfandre (2016)
- Nominating Committee: Maria Irene Moyna (2016)
- Editorial Board: Incoming editors Jeremy King and Jill Brody will propose replacements for Jon Jonz and Pamela Munro, whose terms expired in 2013.

8. Accepted Anderson-Mejías' and Mejías' report on the status of the journal. For 2012-13 there were 28 new manuscripts. Two were returned not juried, 9 were rejected and 17 were accepted on resubmit. Three reviews were published. Sixty-two jurors were used. The journal has a 39.9% acceptance rate. *SWJL* 31(1) is in press with the Presidential address, 6 manuscripts and 1 book review. The current editors will publish through volume 31(2). The new editors will take on 32(1) (2013) under the new journal name, *International Journal of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest*.

9. New business:

Israel Sanz-Sánchez announced a call for papers for abstracts due December 1st, 2013 for a peer-reviewed, co-edited volume of original, research-based scholarship. The working title is *Online Language Teaching Research: Pedagogical, Academic and Institutional Issues*.
