## UPDATE: LASSO XLVIII 2019 Conference at Louisiana State University

The 2019 LASSO meeting, along with the XXX Louisiana Conference on Hispanic Languages and Literatures, will be held at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, LA, on Halloween weekend, October 31 - November 2, 2019. The conference theme is "Decolonization and Diasporas of the Global South". The conference organizers conceive of this theme broadly and view the meeting as a place to reflect on the art forms, cultural practices, political and social movements, and linguistic issues which have emerged in the Global South over the past six centuries. The conference organizers invite abstracts for individual presentations or panels on any aspect of linguistics, Hispanic literature, or Hispanic cultural studies; topics related to the conference theme are particularly welcome. Presentations may be delivered in English or Spanish. Abstracts should be no longer than 250 words in length and must be received on or before July 10, 2019.

We welcome submissions related to topics concerning the Global South as it appears in literary or cultural documents and through different media: manuscripts, books, films, internet, radio, TV, etc. We conceive of the conference as a place to reflect on the art forms, cultural practices, political and social movements, and linguistic effects which have emerged in the Global South over the past six centuries.

Possible topics include, but are not limited to:

- Bilingualism / Bilingual Literature in America
- Borderlands, Cartographies and Dislocation
- Creolization
- The Caribbean: Decolonization, Revolution and Democracy
- Civil/Nation Identity and Transnationalism
- Commodities, Foods, Mobility and the Early Modern "Global" Market
- Displacement, Exile and Intellectual Itineraries
- Ethnic Hybridity, Interethnic Influences and Cultural Appropriations
- Environmental Sustainability, Urban Development and Gentrification
- Freedom, Exile, Utopia and the End of History
- Ghost, Death and Missing Bodies: Violence, Gender and Race
- The Global North, the Global South
- Global Feminism: Women, Democracy, Race and Social Media
- Global Commodities, Trade and Violence
- Global Identity: Gender, Language, Place, Space and Race
- Global Medieval?: Asia, Medieval Iberia and the Mediterranean World
- Language Variation and Contact
- Language Policy
- Linguistic Attitudes
- Magic, Superstition and Science in Early Modern Transatlantic and Early Modern Pacific World
- Negritude

- Religion in the Global South: Sacred Places and Identities

Proposals for panels with multiple speakers are welcome provided they fit within the 90-minute time frame of the concurrent sessions. We also welcome suggestions for workshops, particularly those dealing with interdisciplinary topics.
