# 2024 HELMUT ESAU AWARD

#### DESCRIPTION

This award is named in honor of Helmut Esau, who was active in the early days of LASSO. Professor Esau died in an automobile accident shortly after he was elected to the LASSO presidency. His colleagues at the time established the Esau Award to commemorate his contributions to the Linguistic Association of the Southwest and the profession at large.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Undergraduate and graduate student presenters can submit their revised, polished paper for consideration for the Helmut Esau Award for best student paper.

- To be an undergraduate or graduate student
- Presented a paper in the 2023 Annual Meeting
- Be the sole author of the paper or have co-authored it with other student(s).

Now is an excellent time to revise your paper!

The award is given to the best of all high-quality submissions received. Recipients of this prestigious accolade receive a \$400 cash award (more directions on our LASSO website <a href="https://lassoling.org/conference/">https://lassoling.org/conference/</a>).

Before submitting, make sure to:

- Eliminate any references to you within the paper
- Omit the acknowledgments
- Use the preferred format: Language Style (see Language Style Sheet)
- Papers should not exceed 8,000 words including footnotes.

# 53<sup>rd</sup> ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE LINGUISTIC ASSOCIATION OF THE SOUTHWEST (LASSO)

#### **CALL FOR PAPERS**

LASSO, the Linguistic Association of the Southwest, invites abstract submissions for papers and group panels for its 53rd Annual Meeting to be held at the University of Texas at San Antonio Downtown Campus, on September  $26^{th} - 28^{th}$ , 2024.

The Linguistic Association of the Southwest (LASSO) is a linguistics association in the United States whose purpose is the advancement of the scientific study of language. While many of our members study the languages of the southwestern United States, LASSO has an international focus; it draws its membership and includes linguistic scholarship from any language and any region in the world.

For this year's conference, we welcome papers in all areas of linguistic inquiry including, but not limited to, language variation and change, contact, planning and policy, attitudes and ideologies, syntax, morphology, phonetics, phonology, and teaching methodologies. This year's theme is dialect contact, leveling, and change. As such, we especially encourage submission of papers addressing these phenomena. Our plenary speaker is José Esteban Hernández (The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley).

# SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

Abstracts may be written in English or Spanish. Presentations should be delivered in the same language as the abstract. Only one abstract as single author and a second as co-author will be accepted from any one individual.

Presentation time for papers will be 20 minutes plus 10 minutes for discussion. Proposals for complete panels with multiple speakers are also welcome but must fit within a 90-minute time frame.

Abstracts should be 250-500 words, single-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman font, and should summarize the main points and indicate key aspects of the data and methodology. Use of special fonts should be kept to a minimum. In general, omit the bibliography.

Submissions by graduate students are especially welcome. By presenting at LASSO, graduate students are eligible for the Helmut Esau Prize, which includes a \$400 award.

Participation in LASSO is a privilege of membership. This means that an individual must be a current member in order to present a paper and be listed in the conference program. You may fill out a membership form at the same time you register for the conference at lassoling.org/membership/.

**Deadline for single-paper submissions:** May 31st, 2024

**Deadline for panel submissions:** May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024 **Submissions open:** February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024 - May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024 **Abstract review period:** June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 - June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024

\* The \$2776 in expenditures for the 2023 meeting was to cover for hotel room reservations. The Executive Committee decided to do this one-time contribution because LASSO should support the coverage of unexpected expenses as we transition back from the pandemic. The Executive Committee carefully considered how the transition from COVID restrictions back to some sense of "normalcy" is impacting conference planning, including uncertainties and unknowns of transitioning and big events organizing.

While we, ideally, should be making money at the conference to sustain the event's organizing, that was not the case last year. Given the concerns about setting a precedent, the Executive Director gathered the ideas on steps we can take as preventive measures. The safeguards are as follows:

- brainstorm strategies to keep these risks at a minimum,
- negotiate conference room rates,
- stay away from commitments with hotels on room reservations,
- identify other ways to lower the cost of lodging for conferences (e.g., recommending lower-rate hotels or organizing room sharing alternatives for students or folks on a tighter budget),
- track the number of people who chose to go to the hotels booked by our organization at the past two conferences and get a rough projection for the next event so that the participants cover the number of reserved rooms in the next conference.
- create a brief survey questionnaire to gauge the likelihood of each accepted conference presenter to stay in a conference hotel. The information could then be communicated to the local arrangements committee. The VicePresident can lead on this step as they are the Program Chair and has access to the contact info for presenters.

# 1. Approval of minutes Executive Committee meeting Saturday, September 24th, 2022

Approved agenda from newsletter (need to change year from Patricia Gubitosi's term as Treasurer to 2025)

#### 2. Vacant seats

Katherine Christofferson's term ends, Rachel Showstack (Nominating Committee) nominating committee will be seeking nominations.

# 3. Changes to LASSO's constitution and bylaws

Michelle Ramos Pellicia sought input on how to seek votes on changes.

Discussion at this year's business meeting with opportunity to suggest amendments with at least 5 people signing on; vote to put ballot out; Voting may be conducted online. Suggestion to make vote Article by Article rather than line by line. When there are big changes to be discussed within one article those items might be separated. The changes largely reflect updating the constitution and bylaws with respect to defining roles and procedures.

We also discussed the opportunity of offering conferences or sessions in conferences online to expand the grad students, help with costs, the trick for the program coordinator is to determine which/how many virtual slots there would be and how to work the technology to allow for those people to present. We might want to set aside slots for grad students as virtual.

Additionally, we need to work on identifying people who would like to serve as Executive Director of LASSO in 2025.

# 6. Treasurer Report

We are breaking even somewhat with our funds, but we need to raise revenue. Part of the changes to the constitution and bylaws will address raising membership fees. There is need to make sure that people whose names appear on the program need to pay membership fees even if they are not presenting. We need to make sure that we include this information in the call for papers.



# 7. Local Arrangements Committee Report

We're here! Costs of the conference are high due to the campus constraints. Rooms cost \$2000; Hotel was a bit of a headache; required 80 nights booked, LASSO has to make up the difference. \$5300 collected in conference fees, cost of about \$7500 for allowing conference. Department will help out to defray some costs, LASSO will pick up some funds. Appx. 28 presenters are grad students.
