THANK YOU, CLEVELAND STATE UNIVERSITY!

The 51st Annual Meeting of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest was our first in-person conference as we are transitioning back from the pandemic. Thanks to Antonio Medina-Rivera, we were able to offer a great meeting September 22nd-24th, 2022. The conference sessions showed our continued commitment to social justice, our research work, to our graduate students and junior faculty. Our Fall meeting offered a space to share research work, receive feedback, and the much missed social connections. Our 2022 annual meeting captured all these concerns in its theme: "The Role of the Linguist in Society".

We were honored to have had two keynote speakers. Maricel Santos, San Francisco State University, lead us to explore our ideas "From changing perspectives on 'good language learners' to challenging perspectives on 'good bilingual patients'". Silvina Montrul, University Illinois at Urbana, Champaign, discussed "Differential Object Marking and Language Change in Heritage Languages".

We look forward to our second gathering as we continue to return to face-to-face conferencing. We hope to see many of our LASSOvians at our next meeting October 5-7, 2023 in Denver, Colorado.

HELMUT ESAU AWARD

DESCRIPTION

This award is named in honor of Helmut Esau, who was active in the early days of LASSO. Professor Esau died in an automobile accident shortly after he was elected to the LASSO presidency. His colleagues at the time established the Esau Award to commemorate his contributions to the Linguistic Association of the Southwest and the profession at large.

ELIGIBILITY

Undergraduate and graduate student presenters can submit their revised, polished paper for consideration for the Helmut Esau Award for best student paper.

To be an undergraduate or graduate student
Presented a paper in the 2022 Annual Meeting
Be the sole author of the paper or have co-authored it with other student(s).

The award is given to the best of all high-quality submissions received. Recipients of this prestigious accolade receive a \$400 cash award (more directions on our LASSO website <https://lassoling.org/conference/>).

SUBMISSION

Submit your polished paper to this year's LASSO President, Rachel Showstack (rachel.showstack@wichita.edu). Papers must be submitted to the President by March 15", 2023.

- 2.5. Papers should not exceed 8,000 words including footnotes.

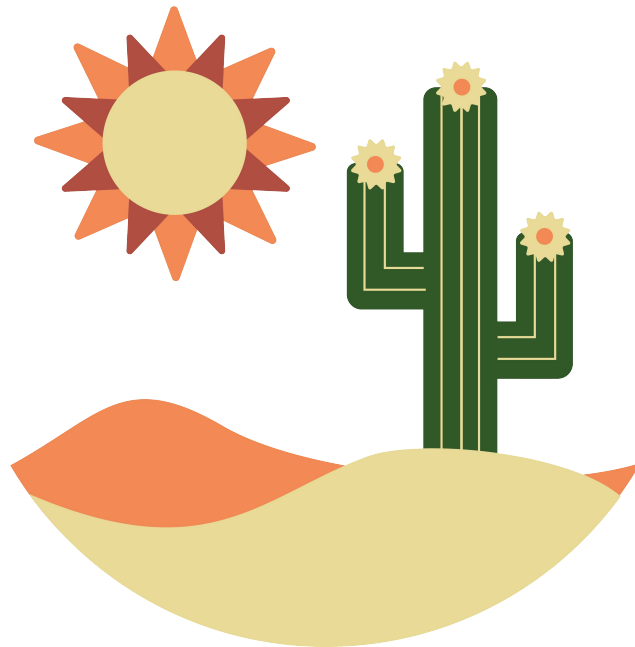

Meeting Description

LASSO, the Linguistic Association of the Southwest, invites abstract submission for papers and group panels for its 52nd Annual Meeting to be held at the University of Denver, Colorado, on October 5-7, 2023. We welcome papers in all areas of linguistics including, but not limited to applied linguistics, linguistic variation, languages in contact, language policy and planning, language attitudes and ideologies, syntax, phonetics and phonology, etc. This year we especially encourage papers addressing any of the following topics: global perspectives on language, linguistic landscapes, language and identity, indigenous languages, community languages, language and migration, language and social justice, language and social media, and language and technology. Submissions by pre-tenured faculty and graduate students are especially welcome. Graduate students who present their work at the conference are eligible for the Helmut Esau Prize, which includes a \$400 award.

Presentation Format

Presentation time for papers will be 20 minutes plus 10 minutes for discussion. Abstracts may be in English, or Spanish. Presentations should be given in the same language as the abstract. Only one abstract as a single author and a second as co-author will be accepted from any one individual. Proposals for complete panels with multiple speakers must fit within the 90 minutes time frame of the conference presentations.

Submission Guidelines

- Abstracts can be submitted to <https://easyabs.linguistlist.org/conference/lassoconference2023> until June 1, 2023.
- Papers may be delivered in English, or Spanish.
- Abstracts should be single-spaced in 12-point Times New Roman font not to exceed 500 words.
- Abstracts need to include the title of the paper and must clearly show the importance of the study, previous research on the topic, the gap in the existing literature, and the study objective and approach.
- To preserve anonymity during the review process, authors should not include their names, academic affiliation, email address or any other identifier or reveal their identity anywhere in the abstract. This information will be completed in a separate form prior to submission in Easy Abs
- Include the title of the paper, area of research, author names, academic affiliations, and e-mail addresses in the form within the abstract submission system.
- Submissions should be in pdf format.

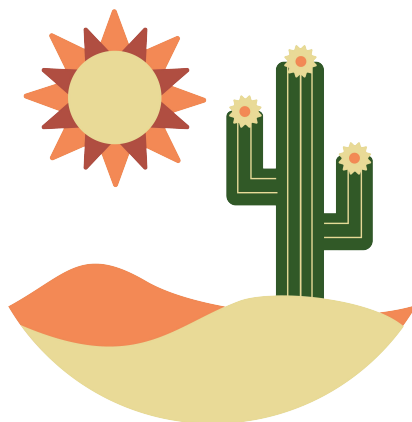
LASSO MEMBERSHIP

Who can submit?

Anyone may submit an original article to be considered for publication in International Journal of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest provided he or she owns the copyright to the work being submitted or is authorized by the copyright owner or owners to submit the article. Authors are the initial owners of the copyrights to their works (an exception in the non-academic world to this might exist if the authors have, as a condition of employment, agreed to transfer copyright to their employer).

General submission rules

Submitted articles cannot have been previously published, nor be forthcoming in an archival journal or book (print or electronic). Please note: "publication" in a working-paper series does not constitute prior publication. In addition, by submitting material to International Journal of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest, the author is stipulating that the material is not currently under review at another journal (electronic or print) and that he or she will not submit the material to another journal (electronic or print) until the completion of the editorial decision process at International Journal of the Linguistic Association of the Southwest. 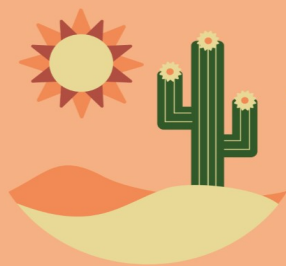

5. Reports (Brevity is appreciated!)

a. LASSO Conference for the next three years

1. Proposals? Tentative options for 2023 are: CalStateU consortium proposal for conference to be held at Bakersfield; Univ Tex. Houston for 2023 in collaboration with College Station. Need to calculate costs. When multiple universities collaborate, you can hold the conference in a neutral location like a hotel. Increased stays in hotels may help reduce conference fee costs. Motion to table discussion and pass decision to Executive Committee, proposed by Jens Clegg, 2nd by Victor Fernández Mallat

b. IJLASSO—Submit your manuscripts for publication

c. Treasurer- as submitted; many are not paying dues; people have been encouraged to pay their dues.

d. Local/Virtual Arrangements Committee: only concern is for people who have asked for reimbursement; suggests being covered by Treasurer since university system is complicated. Executive Committee can make that decision.

e. Vice-President / Program Chair Everything went fine, except for last-minute cancellations.

f. President - Helmut Esau Award—four papers submitted; each paper reviewed by 4 people using rubric; all reviews submitted on time. Sent two reminders to reviewers Irina Lypsic was the recipient of the prize.

g. Development Committee—social media and web page has been updated. There were over 60 people accessing the page. The web hosting fees will be charged every three years.

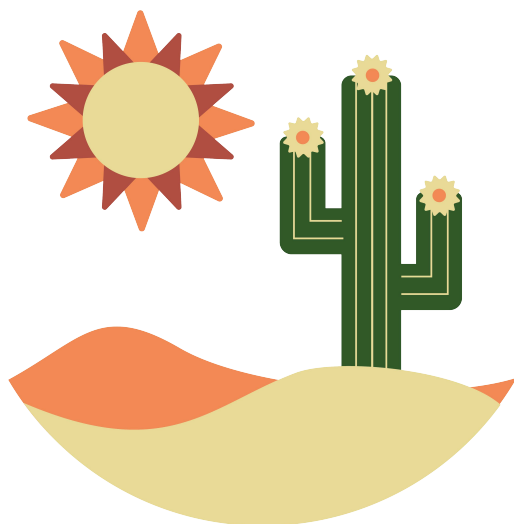

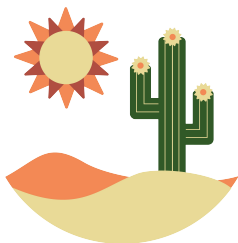
